## **Annual Business Meeting**

Thursday, December 1, 2016 - The MFARC closed out the year in a different way than in the past. After taking an e-mail poll of members, it was decided to cancel the November meeting in favor of an early December meeting. The date was also polled and December 1st was chosen. In addition to the annual business meeting date change, the club also organized and held a door prize drawing at the annual meeting. The drawing was limited to members, however presence at the meeting was not required. There were four main prizes, which included a Yaesu FT-7900R VHF/UHF Mobile rig, a Signalink USB computer-rig interface and two Baofeng UV-5R high powered VHF/UHF handi-talkies. Tickets for the drawings were dispersed based upon some simple criteria, which included meeting attendance, activity participation, Field Day, and so on. The more activity resulted in more tickets and a better chance of winning something.

The Annual Business Meeting started with the drawing, which was conducted by John Nelson Jr - N0DFW and Michael Ketchum - K5MDK. Tickets were dispersed based upon records and reports from members. After a bit of a delay getting the meeting started, about 10 minutes, the drawing began. The Yaesu FT-7900R was won by David Rogers - KG5PKU. The Signalink USB gift certificate to Ham Radio Outlet was won by Jae Stutzman - K5JAE. The first of two Baofeng UV-5R radios was won by Scott Davis - KK7JS, followed by William Sanitate - KG5QCQ, who had

#### **Door Prizes**

**Thursday, December 1, 2016 -** The Majors Field Amateur Radio Club held a door prize drawing at their annual business meeting. There were some great prizes that were given away, which included a Yaesu FT-7900R mobile VHF/UHF rig; Signalink USB gift certificate to Ham Radio Outlet; two Baofeng UV-5R High Power handi talkies along with seven other smaller prizes. The drawing was accomplished by membership participation, meaning hat members earned tickets as they participated in the club meetings and events. 30 members obtained tickets based upon membership and meeting records, and the members were polled to e-mail their activity reports to the Vice President, where additional tickets were awarded for qualifying club events such as the IEEE fair, L3Games, Field Day, Repeater Work Day, Cotton Patch Challenge or for VE sessions and classes. were sent out via e-mail before the drawing. The drawing was performed by our President, Stephen Denison – W5SMD and the winners were as follows:

Club Kenwood TS Saturday, January 7, 2017 – The club owns a Kenwood TS-2000 HF rig. The rig is capable of HF, 6m, VHF, UHF and 1.2 GHz. However, during field day 2016, we discovered that the rig had no output on HF. A quick assumption was the finals have affected. This is possible, as the rig has two separate HF antenna ports and it could have been transmitting on the wrong antenna input. After some searching, it had been suggested to check

the 5A fuse to the driver section. After doing a board probe, the fuse appeared to be blown. I quickly ordered two new board mounted fuses. The new ones came in a square package, instead of a round cylindrical one. In any case, I'm told this is the replacement part.

The hard part was to remove the Finals board. This involved removing RF shielded for the finals tuning package and many cables and connectors. Since the rig uses software to control calibration, there were ribbon connectors also involved. Once it was opened up, I replaced the fuse with ease, using my soldering station.

Next, came putting it all back together again. This

-2000 repairs went a lot faster than I had anticipated. Once everything was buttoned up, I performed a basic functional test. The good news is, the rig was able to transmit on HF and VHF. The bad news is, the HF pour output is limited to less than 10 watts at full power! I did hear the relays clicking in the finals tuning section, but there was very limited output on all HF bands.

> The next step would be to replace the drivers and then the finals if that does not address the problem fully.

> In examining my time, I feel it would be better to send the rig off to Avvid in Mabank, TX for repair. However, he is looking at problems getting driver transistors that actually work. All previous orders for the correct part

have failed. So, we may be looking for a new source of driver transistors. I had no idea this would become a problem.

I'll check back with the club with follow-up articles to explain the progress.
