
Missives and Memos From the Desk of the Vice Prez...

I want to stress that my main goal is to increase participation among members and build a strong sense of community within the club. I will look towards you, our members, for advice and guidance throughout the year. I would also like to thank Larry for his leadership as MFARC's "Top Dog" the past 2 years. Thank you, sir.

FT8 and a CONFESSION: I have been one of those folks who never really considered digital modes to be of much interest, let alone "any fun." Well, over the holiday break, I decided to give FT8 a try; after all, "all of the kids are doing it." Thanks to Victor Paul, I was able to get the software installed and running. With his help, I made my first digital contact on the first try. Now it's time to make a confession –here it is, the 8th of January, and I have yet to make a single voice contact of HF. Part of that is due to being sick and having a sore throat, but a big part of that is the "hunt and pounce" nature of FT8. It is, believe it or not, somewhat exciting being able to see DX call signs scroll past and be able to pick and choose who



will be "the next target." And, it can be done with minimal power. I have worked Japan, England, other



countries in Europe, the Yukon Territories, Canada, Brazil, Venezuela, and many states in the US using 50 watts or less (see pictures). I was even able to make my first-ever 160m contact by stringing a wire up in



a tree with a 5:1 UNUN and some counterpoises, using about 90 watts; including a DX contact into the Caribbean at over 2,200 miles. So, I would encourage folks who haven't already tried it, to give FT8 a serious look.

UHF RAGCHEW: If you are looking for some "repeater action" here locally, I would like to suggest tuning into 441.775 (+5Mhz, PL 100.0). The repeater is run by Dan Gable (K5VOM), and is linked to other repeaters around the country via All-Star. There seems to be activity on the repeater day and night; both local and national. It is located near Quinlan, so it is accessible with 5watts and an HT from Greenville.

Well, folks, looks as if that's about all she wrote for now. I look forward to serving as the MFARC President for 2020.

Membership Dues Change

As it has been announced, E-Club lost their ability to automatically receive dues from payroll deductions. This will curtail E-Club membership, as folks will have to remember to pay their dues manually. The E-Club board is still working on a web-based solution to allow annual dues payments, but we fear this will still stifle the number of E-Club members. On top of this, E-Club is deciding whether to raise dues from \$21 annually to \$25 annually. This \$4.00 increase will be the first increase since the E-Club was first started in the 1970's. Even so, for the benefits of joining multiple clubs under the E-Club umbrella, the E-Club dues are still quite affordable and I look forward to the payment solution to come.

That said, if the increase is approved by the E-Club board, this will translate to an increase in non-E-Club membership dues for the Majors Field Amateur Radio Club. If you keep your E-Club membership up-to-



date, then the dues will remain the same at \$10.00 per year. However, if you are not an E-Club member, there may be an increase from \$31.00 to \$35.00 per year. It is being considered by our Treasurer whether he will apply part of the \$35.00 dues to E-Club membership for the applicant. That would provide \$10.00 for the club and \$25.00 dues to E-Club. The benefit would mean more E-Club members for E-Club and also translate to more money for the radio club from E-Club sponsorship.

This is still a great bargain for what our club can do with the funding provided by E-Club. John Nelson Jr – W7JOY states that he is encouraging everyone to renew their dues as soon as possible. He will be accepting the new \$35.00 dues from non-E-Club members and \$10.00 from those who are E-Club members. Please get your dues to John as soon as you can for this New Year. Better year, John says you can pay him at this month's meeting!
